## **About The Conference**



#### The event was attended by 88 practitioners from over 70 organisations


## **Evaluation of Conference Content - Keynote and Plenary**

82% of attendees thought the keynote and plenary session either good or excellent


## **Evaluation of Conference Content - Workshops**



100% of attendees thought the workshops sessions either good or excellent


## **Evaluation of Conference Usefulness**

#### Overall how useful was the Conference?




The average score for the usefulness of the conference was 4.3 out of 5
