# UCAS Update: Trends and Key Messages





# **2016 cycle overview**

- The number of 18 year olds accepted rose to 238,900, the highest recorded to date, despite a fall in the 18 year old population.
- Young peoples' chances of entering HE have increased, reaching a record of 32.5 per cent in England and 29.5 per cent in Wales.
- Providers increased offer making to over 1.9 million in main scheme.
- 94 per cent of main scheme applicants, who made five choices, received at least one offer.

Higher and medium tariff providers accepted more students.

# Four things have changed for 2017


**EU**: Change from +3,000/year to -3,000/year (c.6,000)

**Nursing**: Fee/support changes associated with around 10% reduction in demand (c.5,000)

**Older age groups**: Falls in older application rates become steeper (c.12,000), mixture of more entering at age 18/19 and stronger job market?

**18 year olds**: Slower growth than recent trend increases (c.3,000)

# Entry rates for UK 18 year olds by country of domicile





#### Entry rates in 2016 for UK 18 year olds by region and country.


There are still **large regional differences** in entry rates for UK 18 year olds.

Nearly **40%** of those in **London** enter, compared with the **lowest rates** of **28%** in the **South West**.


#### **Application and entry rates for UK 18 year olds by sex**




At age 18, **women** are now **third more likely to enter higher education** than **men**.

**37k more men** would need to be accepted to equalise this gap in entry rates.


# 18 year old entry rates for disadvantaged areas (POLAR3 Q1) by country of domicile




#### UK 18 year old entry rates by type of qualification held



# Proportion of all five-choice applicants receiving an offer by number of offers received (cumulative).






- 2–5 offers

# So what?

- There's never been a better time to apply.
- Universities want to recruit.
- More modest grades can secure a great place.
- Lots of offers being made!
- Some 'discounts' available at Confirmation.



### **Prepare for Confirmation and Clearing**

- Ensure personal details are correct.
- Remind students to keep Track up-to-date.
- <u>C&C information</u> now in one place on our website.
- Clearing choice can be added from 15:00 on A level results day.
- Emails about mismatched and unplaced applicants.
- Ensure students are informed about their options.



# Awarding Body Linkage (ABL)


To prevent mismatches through ABL, there are some things you can do to help:

- Work with your exams officer to ensure qualifications entered match those the applicant is actually taking, e.g. has dropped a subject, wrong BTEC, etc.
- Check date of birth is entered correctly, and that month and year on exam records match their UCAS application.
- Check names match, e.g. correct order, shortened first names.

This will help prevent delays at Confirmation post-results. For further information see our guidance on <u>Exams results</u>.

# **Lessons learned – key deadlines**

- Ignoring messages on the Apply for advisers home screen.
- Approving applications but not sending to UCAS.
- Forgetting an application has been returned to an applicant.
- Waiting too long to complete the reference.
- Applicants being held in the 'default group'.






# **Changes at UCAS**

- <u>Qualification reform</u> information, advice, and resources.
- Offer rate calculator.
- Pre-applicant data 2018 entry <u>sign up</u>.



- suggestions for misspelt searches




