

Student Code of Conduct Aimhigher UniFest 2017

We want all students to enjoy and benefit from their time at UniFest.

That is why we expect all students to show responsible behaviour towards the University, its staff and their fellow students. To ensure your safety, security and enjoyment, all students must read, understand and abide by the following code of conduct:

- All students are expected to follow any emergency procedure as directed by University staff.
- Where identification is provided, students are expected to wear it at all times.
- Students are expected to keep a clean, tidy and safe environment around the University. This means that kitchens, washing facilities and living areas etc should be kept clean and tidy, and that all working equipment used as part of the UniFest should be treated with respect.
- Any vandalism, deliberate destruction or defacement of University property, will not be tolerated and may result
 in the placement being closed and the student sent home.
- At residential UniFest events, male and female accommodation will be separate. Males and females are to keep to their own accommodation.
- Students will avoid all areas that are designated out of bounds. These will be made clear by the University.
- No student will leave the campus without prior arrangement with the UniFest staff.
- Inappropriate, abusive and unacceptable behaviour, including but not limited to foul and abusive language, disruptive behaviour, bullying and failure to follow reasonable instructions from the UniFest staff, will not be tolerated and may result in the placement being closed and the student sent home.
- Students are expected to be in their rooms at specified times which will be made known in programme literature and stated on the first day.
- Alcohol and any other illegal substance must not be brought onto the site. Anyone found in possession or under the influence of alcohol or any illegal substance will have their placement closed and be sent home immediately.
- Smoking may be allowed in designated areas for those over the age of 16, at the discretion of the University. No tobacco will be sold to anybody under the age of 18.
- Students are to attend all timetabled activities. Where there is a valid reason for absence, e.g. illness, it is the responsibility of the student to inform UniFest Staff.
- Disruptive behaviour in sessions, interfering with the smooth running of programmes, cheating, copying and plagiarism are examples of misconduct and may result in disciplinary action.
- Serious incidents of misbehaviour may lead to arrangements being made to send the student home. We regard the following as *examples* of serious misbehaviour
 - Physical and Verbal aggression
 - Physical Violence
 - Intimidation of another student or staff-member
 - Behaviour that is intended to offend others that focuses on their
 - Race
 - Sexuality
 - Gender
 - Sensory, physical or cognitive abilities
- Each case of misbehaviour will be dealt with on its own merits, and at the discretion of the UniFest Staff.
- Any other rules and regulations referring either to the University or the scheduled activities will be made clear as soon as it becomes appropriate, and must be obeyed.
