

WHAT IS UNIFEST?

UniFest Summer Schools take place at six universities across the West Midlands. UniFest gives you the chance to spend time exploring university life, meeting students and staff, making friends and having an action packed, fun experience.

WHO IS UNIFEST FOR?

UniFest is for students in Year 10 at state-funded secondary schools in the West Midlands who are from backgrounds and communities that are less likely to be considering university as an option. To apply for a place you will need the support of your school and the consent of your parents or carers, and you should be able to answer "Yes" to at least one of the following:

- My parents or carers did not go to university
- I receive Free School Meals
- · I have a disability or learning difficulty
- · I am in the care of my local authority
- · I am a young carer.

WHAT WILL I DO?

That depends on which UniFest event you choose. Some explore university life and study in general, and others focus on certain career or study options. All UniFest events include lots of hands-on sessions, and a packed programme of fun social activities.

WHAT'S THE CATCH?

There is no catch. UniFest is funded by universities and is totally free of charge. Meals, accommodation, activities and travel costs are all paid for (although you may want to bring a little pocket money with you). The universities will even help you plan how to get to and from events.

HOW DO I GET INVOLVED?

You will need to complete an application form telling us about you and your career interests. Your parents or carers will need to complete parts of the form, and your school will need to approve your application and send it back to us.

WHAT HAPPENS IF THERE ARE MORE APPLICANTS **THAN PLACES?**



STEPS TO UNIFEST

1. APPLY

(JANUARY TO MARCH 2018)


TALK to your parents / carers, and show them this Directory. They will need to agree to your application, and give us information about their educational background (see "Who is UniFest for?").

THINK about your interests and future plans. Look at the events in this Directory and the subject areas they cover. If you have a clear idea of the career you want to follow a specialist event might be right for you.

If you don't have specific career in mind yet, a more general event will give you the chance to try different subject areas. Check out the universities' websites and ask your teachers about it. Do they think going to UniFest will help you? Perhaps they know some older students in you school who went to UniFest last year and could tell you more about it? Either way, you will need your school to support your application, so the sooner you ask the better!

2. RESULT

(APRIL 2018)

If you are offered a place you will receive a letter in April. This will tell you which of your choices you are going to, and give you the contact details of the university staff planning your visit. Make sure you tell your parents/carers and your teacher straight away so that they do not plan anything that clashes with your UniFest experience! If your application is not successful we will write to you with the reasons and give you a telephone number you can ring for more feedback.

WHAT WILL I DO?

Are you interested in finding out more about Science, Technology, Engineering or Maths (STEM) related subjects at university? If yes, then this is the Summer School for you!

WHAT WILL I DO?

Bored of studying the same old subjects at school? Why not learn something new this summer!

Designed to help you think about your future study options, this three day experience introduces a range of fascinating areas, including; Psychology, Law, Sociology and Criminology.

Each day will include thoughtprovoking workshops and interactive sessions. One minute you might be learning about the inside of the brain, the next practicing the latest criminal investigation techniques or questioning witnesses in our courtroom!

You'll also have the opportunity to unwind, with lots of fun social activities, from physical challenges to party nights. You'll also get to 'live like a student' in our on-campus student apartments, where you will meet new friends from other schools and get to know our team of Ambassadors (who are currently studying at university themselves!).

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

Remember – we design our sessions so that you can talk about them (and the skills they have developed) in sixth form / university applications in the future!

HOW WILL I GET THERE?

WHAT WILL I DO?

You will participate in sessions on Outdoor Education, Sports Therapy and Inclusive Sport. You will meet current students who will be best placed to give you an insight into university life as a sport student.

Most of the summer school will take place in cutting-edge facilities, such as the University Arena, which is home to two professional sports teams.

Students will learn from academic experts in their respective fields who will provide a personal insight into what to it is like to work in the sport industry.

Students will also participate in confidence and team-building activities, these will be fun and interactive with a view to inspiring you to potentially one day enter the sports industry as a professional.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

You will experience a variety of taster activities that will give you an insight into what it is like to study a sport course at university. You will have the opportunity to sample facilities such as human performance laboratories, and the University Arena where professional athletes train and compete. Throughout the summer school you will also learn about various career pathways in sport and how to achieve them.

HOW WILL I GET THERE?

Costs of getting to and from the Summer School will be provided for the summer school attendee, and one accompanying adult if required. We recommend that you travel by train; if this is the case the University will buy and post you your tickets in advance.

The University will hand over responsibility for you son/ daughter once they have boarded the train. Upon arrival, our Summer School ambassadors who will be wearing blue t-shirts, and carrying signs saying 'Summer Schools this way!' will meet you. You will be between sites by these ambassadors either by foot or via a minibus.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

PARENTS/

WHY SHOULD MY **CHILD ATTEND?**

CARERS

UniFest gives your child a great chance to find out what university is all about, so that they can make decisions about their future. The experience is exciting, fun and really motivates young people to do their best at school.

WILL MY CHILD BE SAFE?

YES - UniFest universities have a duty of care towards young people that starts from the moment they are handed over to us. Your host university will give you details of hand-over points and travel support arrangements at the start and end of each event. It is important you read and understand this information. so that we can keep everyone safe, especially at the start and end of events.

All UniFest activities are risk assessed and supervised by staff and students who are checked by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS...the new name for CRB). DBS approved staff and students stay overnight to supervise things.

BEHAVIOUR

The universities expect everyone to behave responsibly and follow instructions. All students must sign a Code of Conduct that makes it clear that they may be sent home if they do not behave as expected. If there are problems you will be kept informed throughout.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

UniFest is FREE. If you have to pay for travel the university will send you details of how to claim money back.

WHY DO YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT **MY EDUCATION BACKGROUND?**

Young people from families where no one has been to university are much less likely to go into higher education and the professions. We need to find out about your background so we can offer places to young people who need extra support to decide if university is right for them.

HOW WILL YOU PROTECT OUR PERSONAL DATA?

To take part in UniFest we need to share information about you and your child with Aimhigher

universities so they can run the programme. The forms you will be sent if you are offered a place are important, and we will not be able to accommodate anyone who does not complete them in full and return them on time. The application form also asks your permission to use data to help us see if young people attending UniFest apply for university. Any information we publish will not make reference to you or your child individually. Full details are on the application form.

WHAT IF MY CHILD **BECOMES ILL?**

We will contact you, using the details you have provided on the application/consent form. It is important that you tell us if these change before the event.

HOW CAN I CONTACT MY CHILD?

You will be given emergency contact details for the university in the run up to the event. Young people can take mobile phones but do so at their own risk.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD **NEED TO BRING?**

The universities will give you details of the type and amount of clothing and other personal belongings they will need.

PEOPLE

WILL I HAVE TO DO **REAL WORK?**

UniFest is your chance to see what being a student is all about... so **YES** you will be expected to take part in all planned sessions, but the universities will make it exciting and interesting.

WILL I BE WITH MY FRIENDS?

Often friends from the same school go to the same event, but a big part of UniFest is meeting new people and making new friends.

WHAT SORT OF CLOTHES **SHOULD I WEAR?**

Casual clothes are appropriate most of the time. You may want to take sportswear and something a little smarter for evening activities. If you need any special clothing we will let you know before the event.

WHERE AND WHAT WILL I EAT?

All your meals will be provided, and we will cater for any special dietary needs.

WILL I NEED TO BRING **ANY MONEY?**

You can bring a small amount of money for snacks/drinks but you will be responsible for it at all times.

SCHOOL **STAFF**

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST MY SCHOOL?

UniFest is free of charge.

HOW DOES ATTENDING HELP YOUNG PEOPLE?

The Sutton Trust has evaluated summer schools as a high impact intervention as part of their Pupil premium toolkit. Attending can raise aspirations, improve attainment and contribute to your duty to provide impartial careers education and guidance.

WHICH LEARNERS **SHOULD APPLY?**

Young people whose parents / carers do not have graduatelevel qualifications, those with disabilities and / or learning difficulties and those in or leaving the care system will be given priority. Applications from young people receiving Free-School Meals during the last 6 years will be looked upon favourably. We also welcome applications from young carers.

WILL WE NEED TO ATTEND EVENTS TO SUPERVISE OUR STUDENTS?

You do not need to supervise young people on UniFest events. Full details of the safeguarding arrangements for UniFest are on our website.
