

In this event, pupils will first gain an understanding of higher education pathways, followed by an introductory speech from our host from the day, Kari Lawler - a teenage entrepreneur from Birmingham who has set up her own Al consultancy business. She will deliver much of the day, aside from when pupils have the experience to understand university life from current students on their campus tour. Workshops from the day are as follows:

Workshop One: Firstly, we will give the students a brief look at the history of Al, starting with the birth of the term AI at the 1956 Dartmouth conference.
