WHAT IS UNIFEST?

UniFest Summer Schools take place at 6 universities across the West Midlands. UniFest gives you the chance to spend time exploring university life, meeting students and staff, making friends and having an action packed, fun experience.

WHO IS UNIFEST FOR?

UniFest is for students in Year 10 at state-funded secondary schools in the West Midlands who are from backgrounds and communities that are less likely to be considering university as an option. To apply for a place, you will need the support of your school and the consent of your parents or carers, and you should be able to answer "Yes" to at least one of the following:

- My parents or carers did not go to university
- I receive Free School Meals
- I have a disability or learning difficulty
- I am in the care of my local authority
- I am a young carer
- I live in an area where not many young people go to university

WHAT WILL I DO?

That depends on which UniFest event you choose. Some explore university life and study in general and others focus on certain career or study options. All UniFest events include lots of hands-on sessions, and a packed programme of fun social activities.

WHAT'S THE CATCH?

There is no catch. UniFest is funded by universities and schools and is totally free of charge. For residential UniFest events, meals, accommodation and activities are all paid for (although you may want to bring a little pocket money with you). The universities will help you plan how to get to and from events.

HOW DO I GET **INVOLVED?**

You will need to complete an application form telling us about you and your career interests. Your parents or carers will need to complete parts of the form, and your school will need to approve your application.

STEPS TO UNIFEST

1. APPLY

Talk to your parent/carers, and show them this Directory. They will need to agree to your application, and give us information about their education and work background (see "Who is UniFest for?").

Think about your interests and future plans. Look at the events in this Directory and the subject areas they cover. If you have a clear idea of the career you want to follow a specialist event might be right for you. If you don't have specific career in mind yet, a more general event will give you the chance to try different subject areas. Check out the universities' websites and ask your teachers about it. Do they think going to

UniFest will help you? Perhaps they know some older students in you school who went to UniFest last year and could tell you more about it? Either way, you will need your school to support your application, so the sooner you ask the better!

Apply! Complete the online application form at www. aimhigherwm.ac.uk/unifest with your parent or carer and let a teacher know that you are applying. Don't forget to make a note of the dates of your selected events, and keep them free!

We will send you an email confirming that we have received your application, and contact you if there is any information missing or if you have any additional support needs.

2. RESULT! (APRIL 2022)

If you are offered a place you will be contacted in April 2022. This will tell you which of your choices you are going to, and give you the contact details of the university staff planning your visit. Make sure you tell your parents/carers and your teacher straight away so that they do not plan anything that clashes with your UniFest experience! If your application is not successful, we will write to you with the reasons and provide our contact details if you would like to request more feedback.

3. GET READY

Your host university will be in touch with further information about the event, and to ask if you need any special arrangements to look after you during your stay. They will tell you more about travel arrangements and meeting points, and give you the contact details of people you can talk to if you have any queries in the run up to your UniFest experience.

4. GO!

UniFest goes live, with events taking place from late June all the way through to late July.

WHAT WILL I DO?

HOW WILL I GET THERE?

With many transport options available to reach us in Birmingham city centre we hope you can make your own way to Aston University's campus.

There will be many ambassadors dotted around the campus on the day to make sure you can find your way to reception.

During the summer school all transport arrangements for activities will be organized and paid for by the University.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

You will learn more about university and higher education, gaining insight into what life is like as a university student. You will also have a unique opportunity to learn what it could be like to study a sport and/or life science course at Birmingham City University. Academic staff and student ambassadors will teach you more about their university experiences, what course content and how these degrees can be applied to relevant careers in the industry.

HOW WILL I GET THERE?

Attendees will be asked to arrive and depart from University Locks, student accommodation at our City Centre Campus (address in 'location' section). Arrival will be in the morning of Wednesday

13th July, and departure will be in the afternoon of Friday 15th July. University staff and student ambassadors will meet and chaperone attendees at arrival and departure points/times.

Parents and carers will be contacted in advance of the residential visit to confirm if they will be dropping off/collecting their child, or if their child requires alternative transport. In the case of parents/carers arranging transport, parents/carers can submit a reimbursement claim for mileage and parking, if applicable. In the case of alternative transport, we may be able to provide public or taxi transport for attendees to and from campus. This is subject to budget, so details of this will be confirmed with parents, carers and attendees closer to the time. Parents will be contacted to share any additional requirements in advance of the visit, so any accessibility requirements will be considered in travel arrangements.

HOW WILL I GET THERE?

All reasonable travel costs for these journeys can be reimbursed upon proof of receipt.

For those of you who will be dropped off to our university campus by parents/carers, we will be on hand to direct you to the car park and guide pupils into the building.

Are you a practical learner? Do you prefer a range of assessments and not just exams? Have you ever

heard of a vocational university?

This non-residential summer school will give you real life experience of what it's like attending a vocational university, whilst working in 'departments' to work on a group project linked to the Commonwealth Games. This will allow you to explore a range of subject areas such as events management, finance, sports therapy, food and hospitality and more. Whilst completing this project you will also learn about the difference between vocational and academic universities, student finance, degree apprenticeships,

career opportunities after university from lecturers, support staff, alumni and employers.

You will have your own timetable including lectures. practical sessions, social events, site/employer visits and group study time. This will conclude with an event showcase to celebrate your work in front of an industry panel.

You have two options for travel, public transport or travelling by car.

If you're travelling by public transport, our Student Ambassadors will meet you at Birmingham New Street Station. Keep your receipts for as all reasonable travel costs will be covered when you provide these receipts.

If you are travelling by car, there is parking available at The Link for drop off only. You'll be able to claim back the mileage for your travel.

WHAT WILL I DO?

This exciting summer school will give you the opportunity to experience what it is like being a student at university via participation in sessions on Law, Forensic Biology, Criminology and Policing. You will get a taste of the state-of-the-art university facilities available, such as a custom-built courtroom where you will be working on a mock trial. Students will learn from academic experts whom, with their knowledge combined will share with you what it is like to speak in court and what to do when presenting evidence collected at a crime scene. You will also get a perspective of the minds of criminals to explore why crimes are committed in the first place. By the end of the summer school, you will have a greater understanding of what options you will need to take to pursue a career in criminal justice.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

You will develop insights into Psychology, Criminology, Forensic Biology and Law. You will also experience what it is like working towards a degree. Throughout the summer school, you will work with current University of Worcester students, providing you with an ideal opportunity to discover more about the student's eye-view of university life.

We will also take time to look at the range of careers available in the justice sector.

HOW WILL I GET THERE?

Costs of getting to and from the Summer School will be provided for the summer school attendee, and one accompanying adult if required. We recommend that you travel by train; the university will buy and post you your tickets beforehand. The first day will be delivered virtually, the second and third days will be in person on campus.

The university assumes responsibility for your child when they are signed in either at the University or at the train station. We will hand over responsibility for your child once they have boarded the train or been collected from the University.

Upon arrival you will be met by our Summer School ambassadors who will be wearing blue t-shirts, and carrying signs saying 'Summer Schools this way!' You will be guided to and from our campus by these.



FREQUENTLY **ASKED QUESTIONS**

PARENTS/ CARERS

WHY SHOULD MY CHILD ATTEND?

UniFest gives your child a great chance to find out what university is all about, so that they can make decisions about their future. The experience is exciting, fun and really motivates young people to do their best at school.

WILL MY CHILD BE SAFE?

Yes. UniFest universities have a duty of care towards young people that starts from the moment they are handed over to us. Your host university will give you details of hand-over points and travel support arrangements at the start and end of each event. It is important you read and understand this information, so that we can keep everyone safe, especially at the start and end of events.

All UniFest activities are risk assessed and supervised by staff and students who are checked by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS). DBS approved staff and students stay overnight to supervise things.

BEHAVIOUR

The universities expect everyone to behave responsibly and follow instructions. All students must sign a Code of Conduct that makes it clear that they may be sent home if they do not behave as expected. If there are problems you will be kept informed throughout..

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

UniFest is FREE. If you have to pay for travel the university will send you details of how to claim money back.

WHY DO YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MY **EDUCATION AND WORK BACKGROUND?**

Young people from families where no one has been to university are much less likely to go into higher education and the professions. We need to find out about your background so we can offer places to young people who need extra support to decide if university is right for them.

HOW WILL YOU PROTECT **OUR PERSONAL DATA?**

To take part in UniFest we need to share information about you and your child with Aimhigher

universities so they can run the programme. The forms you will be sent if you are offered a place are important, and we will not be able to accommodate anyone who does not complete them in full and return them on time. The application form also asks your permission to use data to help us see if young people attending UniFest apply for university. Any information we publish will not make reference to you or your child individually. Full details are on the application form.

WHAT IF MY CHILD **BECOMES ILL?**

We will contact you, using the details you have provided on the application/consent form. It is important that you tell us if these change before the event.

HOW CAN I CONTACT MY CHILD?

You will be given emergency contact details for the university in the run up to the event. Young people can take mobile phones but do so at their own risk.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD **NEED TO BRING?**

The universities will give you details of the type and amount of clothing and other personal belongings they will need.

YOUNG PEOPLE

WILL I HAVE TO DO REAL WORK?

UniFest is your chance to see what being a student is all about. So yes, you will be expected to take part in all planned sessions, but the universities will make it exciting and interesting.

WILL I BE WITH MY FRIENDS?

Often friends from the same school go to the same event, but a big part of UniFest is meeting new people and making new friends.

WHAT SORT OF CLOTHES **SHOULD I WEAR?**

Casual clothes are appropriate most of the time. You may want to take sportswear and something a little smarter for evening activities. If you need any special clothing, we will let you know before the event.

WHERE AND WHAT WILL IEAT?

All your meals will be provided, and we will cater for any dietary requirements.

WILL I NEED TO BRING ANY MONEY?

You can bring a small amount of money for snacks/drinks but you will be responsible for it at all.

SCHOOL **STAFF**

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST MY SCHOOL?

UniFest is free of charge.

HOW DOES ATTENDING HELP YOUNG PEOPLE?

The Sutton Trust has evaluated summer schools as a high impact intervention as part of their Pupil premium toolkit. Attending can raise aspirations, improve attainment and contribute to your duty to provide impartial careers education and guidance.

WHICH LEARNERS SHOULD APPLY?

Young people whose parents/ carers do not have graduatelevel qualifications, those with disabilities and/or learning difficulties and those in or leaving **"IT'S SHOWN ME** THAT HIGHER **EDUCATION IS FOR** PEOPLE LIKE ME"



the care system will be given priority. Applications from young people receiving Free-School Meals during the last 6 years will be looked upon favourably. We also welcome applications from young carers.

WILL WE NEED TO ATTEND EVENTS **TO SUPERVISE OUR** STUDENTS?

You do not need to supervise young people on UniFest events. Full details of the safeguarding arrangements for UniFest are on our website.
